## **Arapahoe County Current Issues**

Government overreach creates new opportunities for building bridges with neighbors. Here's an example of working with others with whom we may not agree perfectly: <u>This lady</u> works daily with the homeless and understands the realities of homelessness. She is furious with Englewood government making bad problems much worse. Her willingness to take on city hall created mutual respect between her and other citizens questioning the Englewood city council's one-size-fits-all "solution" of building denser housing.

They may not agree on solutions, yet, but they see the same urgent problem, finding themselves allies in the common goal of opposing government overreach. A common goal allows for conversations about real needs, allowing both homeowners and homeless advocates to respect and understand each other better.

Together the citizens are doing research, sharing information, following the money, and asking some very pointed questions about the legality and costs of certain Englewood programs. (Sheridan and Littleton are involved too.) They're looking into why government money flows into certain churches, how certain officials are paid, and whether these programs hurt the very people they claim to help. Watch a variety of citizens involving themselves in government on the meeting video from about 1:20 to 2:43.

## Speak Up for Your County, City, Schools

Your biggest contribution is not your vote, but your involvement. You will have most effect if you start at your local level. Begin today, attending public meetings regularly – you will learn who the people are, whom to trust, and what motivates them. Don't get overwhelmed by the number of meetings – in many areas you could attend all the meetings up through the county level for an average time investment of just six hours a month! If you have nothing to say, listen – you'll almost certainly find something to say soon!

School's out, so school boards are down to their last meeting of the school year; if you miss it, you'll have to wait till August or September!

#### How to speak up

Check the website for changes; the schedule below may not have the most recent updates.

For most people it's a good idea to write out ahead of time what you want to say and practice it a time or two to make sure it fits in the time limit.

Most councils/boards give you 3 minutes to speak, which is arguably infringing on your right to free speech, but in practice if you can't say what you have to say in 3 minutes, people will tune you out. If enough people show up to speak they may cut the allowed time to 2 minutes, so be prepared with what you would cut out if necessary.

Many meetings hold public comment time early in the agenda, so you don't have to stay for the whole meeting, though if you do, then they know you're watching them! Most meetings are recorded; you could catch up on the rest of the meeting later by playing the video during your drivetime.

Some boards have been known to move the public comment time until after the most boring parts of the meeting; if so, hang in there and wait; the more they try to discourage you, the more you know you are making a difference!
