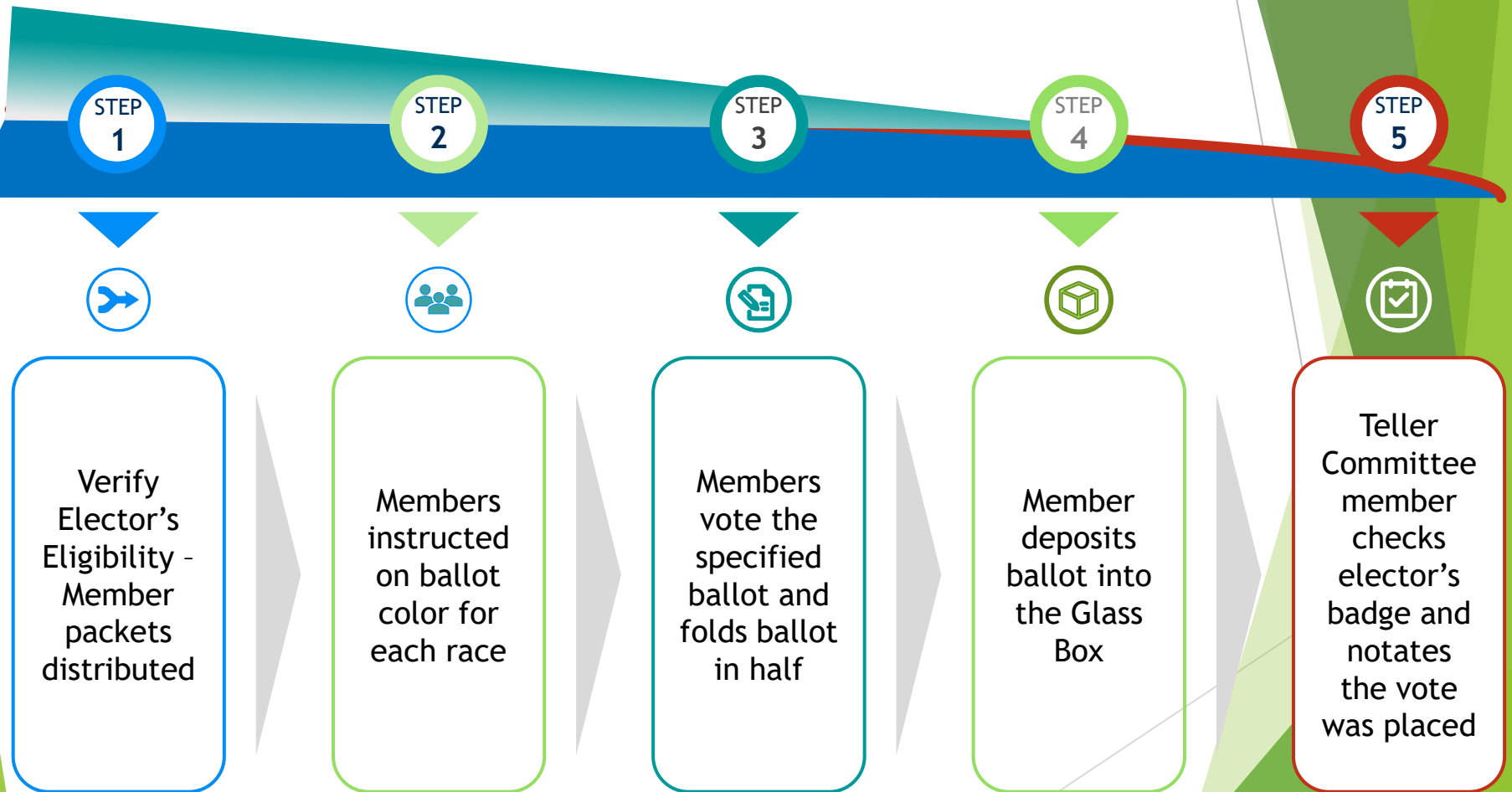

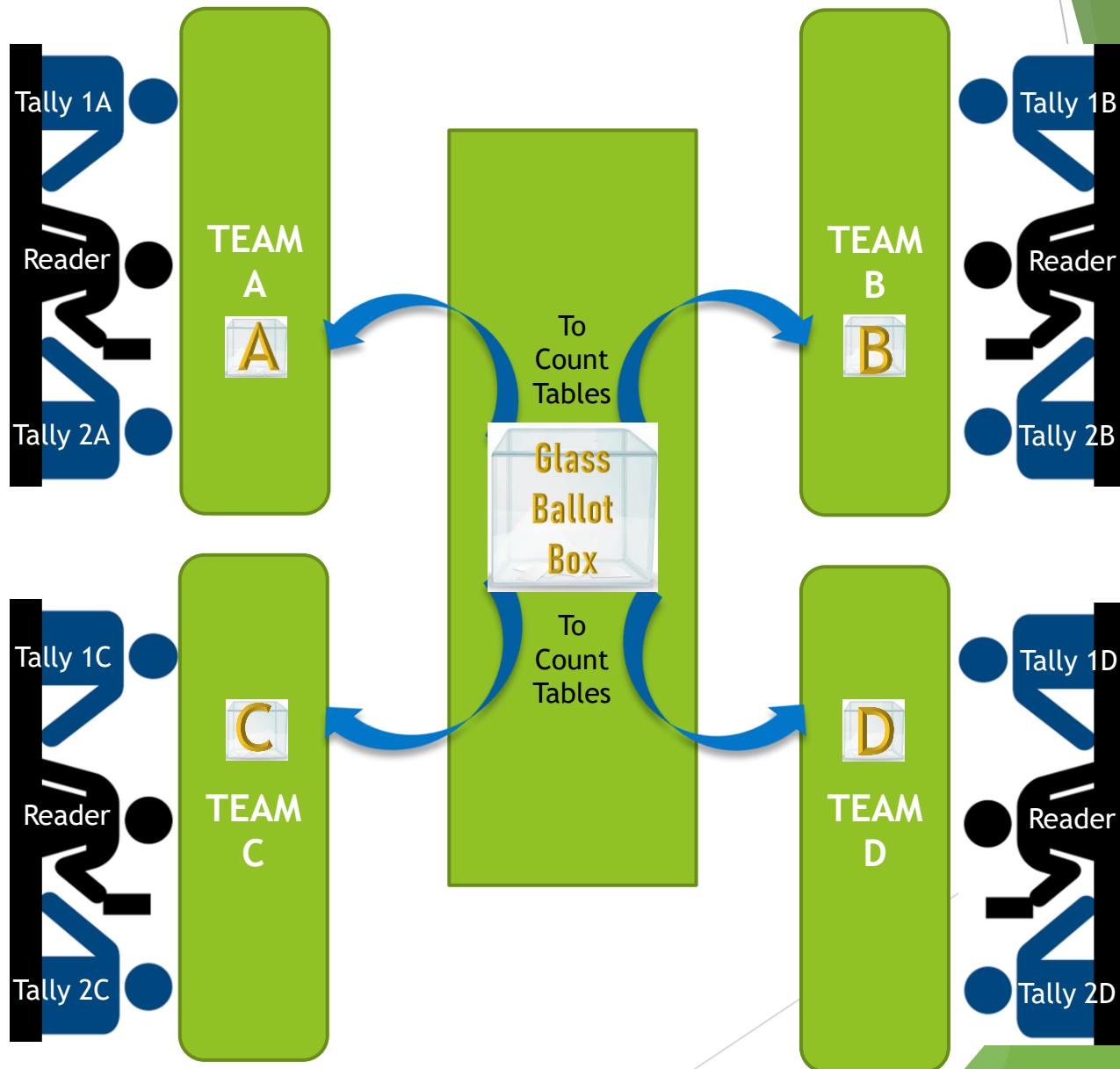

Set-Up Process

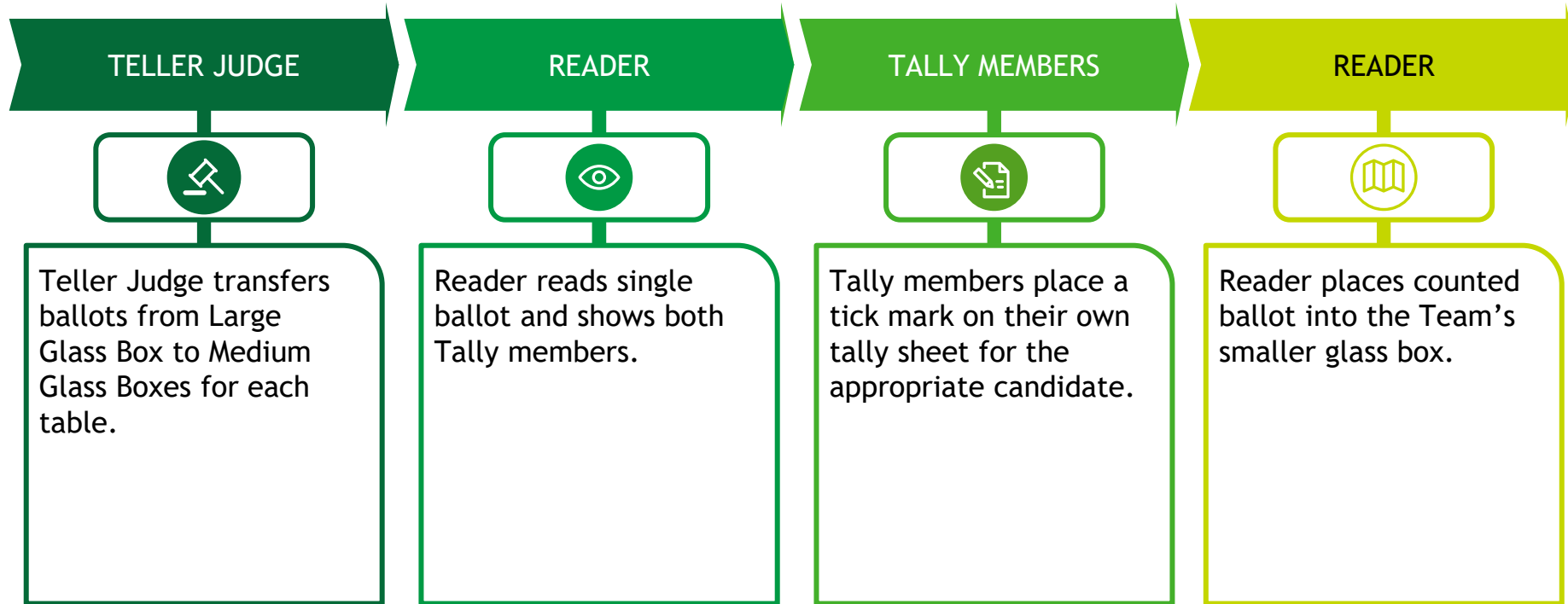


COUNTING TABLES



FAQs


 Is the glass box balloting process best suited for only small group voting?

 No, it is also very useful for much larger scale scenarios. It was recently used for an assembly of the recently formed 8th Congressional District of Colorado, which had over 400 voting attendees. The system worked very efficiently and got rave reviews from participants.

 Could this process be used for a larger scale election, such as a municipal race?

 Yes. There would need to be more volunteers to act as ballot counters, etc. but current vote centers already utilize volunteer poll watchers and election judges, so this should be an easy transition.

 Is the glass box balloting process a lot slower than using electronic voting devices?

 No, people are often surprised at how quickly the actual process goes. With the volunteer ballot counting teams working together, many ballots can be tallied in a relatively short amount of time, with the results available within minutes.
